1. Legislative Changes

+++ BILL TO PREVENT MISUSE OF WARNING LETTERS ISSUED FOR DATA PROTECTION INFRINGE-MENTS +++

The German government has tabled a legislative proposal in order to prevent warning letters that are issued illegitimately, especially for infringements of the GDPR.

+++ ECJ: EU EMPLOYERS MUST TRACK WORKING HOURS +++

The European Court of Justice (ECJ) has ruled that EU member states must obligate employers to set up a system which records the hours their employees actually work (Rs. C-55/18 – 'Federación de Servicios de Comisiones Obreras / Deutsche Bank SAE').

+++ ADMINISTRATIVE COURT OF LÜNEBURG CON-FIRMS PROHIBITION OF GPS TRACKING SYSTEMS IN COMPANY CARS +++

The Administrative Court of Lüneburg has issued a partial judgment (case no. 4 A 12/19) confirming a notice by the Data Protection Authority of the State of Lower Saxony stating that the use of a GPS tracking system in company cars was inadmissible in the specific case.

+++ FINLAND'S SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY REVIEWS ASSESSMENT OF CREDITWORTHINESS BY FINANCIAL SERVICE PROVIDER +++

The Finnish Data Protection Supervisory Authority has reviewed a financial credit company's processing of data used to assess the creditworthiness of potential customers, holding it to be unlawful in part.

+++ BANK FINED FOR STORING DATA OF FORMER CUSTOMERS +++

The Data Protection Supervisory Authority of Berlin has imposed a fine of EUR 50,000 on a bank because it stores the data of former customers for the prevention of money laundering, even though there is no suspicion that money is actually being laundered which would justify continuous storage.
